The Steart Wildlife Habitat Creation Scheme is under construction as anyone visiting the area can see, although it is running a little behind due to the exceptionally wet weather A 200m breach in the River Parrett flood bank to allow tidal inundation is planned for gust/September this year. The existing footpaths will be diverted and new car parking will be provided together with toilets and a small visitor centre. A new footpath linking Combwich, Otterhampton and Steart has been created and will be opened in the spring.
