**This glorious summer** is reminiscent of all our childhood memories with almost endless blue skies and sunshine. In our corner of the country we are ideally placed to make the most of the good weather with access to the coast, Somerset levels and the Quantock Hills. The new footpath from Combwich to Stert Drove recently opened and provides safe walking and cycling between Combwich, Otterhampton, Stockland Bristol

and Steart and is proving immensely popular. Soon the path will be extended to provide yet more possibilities for walkers and cyclists.

Unfortunately the much heralded breach in the River Parrett to allow tidal flooding to form the salt marsh wetlands has had to be postponed until September 2014. The unusual weather over the last year has caused delay in the construction process and though earthworks to create the reserve are complete, they will require



time to allow vegetation to grow and strengthen the new embankments. For more information go to the website which has a direct link to WWT's lapsed time cameras.

Many local organisations took a break in August, but not the ever more successful monthly Combwich Market or the Friday Morning Coffee Club which entertains locals to coffee and gossip and much more from 10-12 each Friday morning. The Parish Plan Steering Group were also busy and organised a Drop-In Day to gather people's views on a range of issues in the parish.

### This Autumn and Winter

Whether we like it or not the days are getting shorter and in OPRA we are arranging our winter programme. Our usual series of Village Hall Talks will start from Thursday 19th September and will continue until March with the exception of December. The first of our Autumn Sunday morning Walks will be on 15th September which will involve a circular walk on the other side of the River Parrett (with views of Combwich) and will be suitable for all the family.

A new event this year will be a Race Night at the Anchor on Saturday 5th October to raise funds and have fun. Funds raised will be used to help replace the aging tractor used to cut the grass on the common.

The Annual Firework Display will be on Sunday 3rd November and the ever popular Senior Citizens' Christmas Dinner will be on Saturday 7th December. And on the following day the lighting of the village Christmas tree.



We have also had reports of children swimming in the new South Brook adjacent to the new footpath. The managers of the project have asked us to point out the dangers of becoming trapped unseen under water and also of bacterial infections such as Leptospirosisrious (Weils disease).

The 100 Club is not just about giving, it is also about taking part in the weekly and monthly draws and getting some of your money back!
