OTTERHAMPTON AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECT

Otterhampton Parish Council has recognised that some local people from the parish may find it hard to find a decent home at a price they can afford within the parish. Over the past few months it has been looking at what can be done to help local people who need help to access an affordable home. Affordable housing can include both rented and affordable-homeownership homes.

At the end of 2011 the Community Plan Steering Group conducted a Housing Needs Survey on behalf of the Parish Council and the work was undertaken by the Community Council for Somerset supported by Sedgemoor District Council. It was hoped that the results would reveal the level of unmet housing need. While the survey and associated information revealed a need of between six and fourteen homes there was insufficient information to determine the type and size of homes required. For this reason the Parish Council has decided to "refresh" the survey.

People who completed the original survey in 2011 will be contacted directly. The survey is also open to any other local person or person with a local connection who thinks they might want help with their housing.

If you (or a member of your family) feel that you might need help in finding an affordable home in Otterhampton please fill in a Housing Needs Survey Form. Completed forms should be returned to District Council for analysis. Any information provided will be treated with the upmost privacy

People who own land locally, who feel that they might be interested in making their land available for any future affordable housing project are also being encouraged to make contact. PARKING

We all know that parking can be difficult in Combwich, but if you have to park on a pavement please allow enough enough room for push/wheel chairs and mobility scooters to pass without being forced on to the road. Dropped curbs should also be kept clear as they are needed by the same users.

RURAL DEFIBULATORS

John Edney the Chairman of Somerset County Council has set up a scheme for Defibulators to be located in rural areas around Somerset. They would be sited in key areas and volunteers from within the local community will be trained in their use.

This equipment is a 'Lifesaver' and can make a vital difference to the outcome of a life threatening cardiac arrest. The Parish Council are looking for 5 people who are willing to be trained to use a difibulator and can attend a training course on the 23rd January 2013.

'DARK NIGHTS RISING' & STREET LIGHTING

'Dark Nights Rising' has nothing to do with 'super heroes' but is part of a consultation by SCC that will reduce 'light pollution' and reduce energy costs. This would involve;

- Some street lights being dimmed
- Some street lights being removed
- Some being switched off between midnight & 5.30am

Somerset has 45,000 street lamps and whilst we only have a few in our parish they do burn throughout the hours of darkness.
