#### **PARISH ISSUES**

As everyone understands, our parish villages are and will be subject to a great deal of change. In adapting to this, the Parish Council will seek to ensure this is done in a manner of least disturbance for residents, upholds the safety of villagers and restricts the pressures to urbanise our rural environment. The opening of the new bridle way is welcomed for walkers, horse riders and cyclists. Issues have arisen, including a large increase in vehicles on the track way and Common in Combwich. Whilst some landowners and user groups are perceived to have a private right of access, we remind everyone that, from leaving the metalled surface on Riverside there is no public right of way for vehicles. both along the track and across the common. This restriction includes no parking on the common land. The Common is owned by the Parish Council and is registered as a village green which imposes severe restrictions on what legally can take place. Unfortunately due to the real and possibly future increase in use (and miss-use) the council are obliged to restrict vehicular access. So far this has been carried out in a low key manner which it is hoped will suffice. We acknowledge and regret any inconvenience for residents who are affected.

The popularity of the area for dog walking has also produced problems. The bin for dog waste on the Common is now full after two days and the council is looking into purchasing a larger bin. If the bin is full please do not dump your waste bags in the grass but take it home or use some of the less pressured bins provided in the village. We will be working with the dog wardens to possibly impose fines and prosecutions if necessary, for all the 'doggy' problems so evident, on any less considerate owners.

The bus shelter has been repaired and the cracked stonework is being monitored. This is only a temporary solution but it is safe to use at present.

EDF and the District/County Councils are conducting a feasibility study into a safe cycle route for Hinkley Point workers. It appears two of the preferred options would entail commuter cyclists directed through Combwich and onto the new bridle way network.

We wish to assure residents that the PC will highlight any issues for residents that will arise should the 'project board' decide to pursue this concept. We may resist Combwich being used as a 'cheap' option, rather than a designated route alongside the C182, dependant on possible usage. The safety and amenity of Combwich residents is paramount. We must stress it is early days, with no funding available as yet.

These are all contentious issues and the PC are happy to discuss them with residents either at the monthly meetings held in the village hall, or by contacting the Chair (01278 653240) or the Clerk (01278 652626) of the Parish Council or indeed any Parish Councillor.

#### **VILLAGE HALL**

Good and bad news from the village hall. The good news is that much needed redecoration has been carried out in many areas of the hall. Our very sincere thanks to Andy Turnbull who persuaded Balfour Beatty & EDF to provide a team of craftsmen, for a short period of time as part of a community project. Andy with Nick Tester & Andy Bryant have also worked in their own time as well. The VH only had to supply the paint 'by the gallon'. It has been a great boost to have such enthusiastic help from everyone.

The only area that can't be decorated is the main hall and here is the bad news. The VH committee have had a surveyor to inspect the damp wall in the main hall. The report indicated, that along with rising damp, we also have water penetration from poor guttering, inadequate felting and missing external wall tiling. Rainwater is seeping down inside the upper timber frame wall and causing the plasterwork to seriously deteriorate. Remedial work to repair and weather proof the wall will cost in the region of £10,000.

To raise this amount the committee will need to apply for grants and carry out fund raising events for match funding. They need the support of the whole community at these events.

Remember the village hall belongs to everyone and needs to be preserved for future generations to use.

## **THE END OF AN ERA**



Peter Shaw Clerk to Otterhampton Parish Council will retire in March after 25 years of service to the council and the community.

He was formerly a quantity surveyor with Sedgemoor District Council and then in private practice. In partnership with his wife Wendy who did all the typing and much

more, Peter guided the council through a host of issues facing the community. Sadly Wendy passed away in 2009.

Looking back, Peter believes the campaign to have the Ship Inn 'listed' when developers wanted to pull it down, as one of the more significant achievements. It was finally won when he and Wendy together with Alan Choudry, then chair of the council, went to London to make their case. The pub closed, but the building remains as attractive private homes in Ship Lane. Another achievement was the purchase of Wharf Road from British Nuclear Fuels and the transformation from what was effectively a dump to a landscaped access road to the Parrett Trail and the Combwich Ponds, the latter unhappily closed to the public now.

Peter and the council, supported by local residents, took on Westbury Homes who had flouted planning regulations in the building of houses at the bottom of Nursery Close. They were forced to demolish one house as it was over a metre too high and start again. He also lists high among the achievements during his time, the welcome feature at the entrance to Combwich. Recent years have seen increased work for the clerk and the council with the proposed Hinkley Point C developments at Combwich Wharf and the Laydown area, and of course the more welcome developments at Steart.

Throughout the last 25 years and numerous changes in membership of the council, Peter has always been there to guide, service and support the councillors. His knowledge of the law and procedures and gentle persuasive skills has been of immense value to the council and the wider community in so many ways.

Peter is looking forward to having the time for more travel, but will be heavily involved in the process of finding his replacement. He will be greatly missed on the council but will continue to live in Combwich and maintain a keen interest in local affairs.
