# Otter Tales

A brave photographer perhaps? No, just a unique opportunity to see the village from a different perspective which was presented when scaffolding was erected to repair the church spire.

It is hoped that the Church will be open again early next year when the once familiar sound of the bells will ring out again.

It has taken many months to organise sufficient funding for the work on the Church spire to start and that has now been achieved. The scaffold is up and repairs to the spire are finally under way.

The professionals have now been able to inspect the spire much more closely and a small group of villagers were also able to climb to the top, not only to see the view (which is awesome) but also to inspect the damage.

Unfortunately, the damage to the spire is much worse than originally anticipated and if left much longer the whole steeple was likely to fall. The scaffold was designed to keep the whole structure as secure and safe as possible, and remedial work has now been done to make it safe whilst the full repairs are undertaken. This involves structural repairs to the external masonry as well as internal repairs to the bells and pendulum. It is anticipated that the works will take about six months.

In the meantime, Church services will be restarting in Combwich on 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month in Otterhampton School at 11.15am, beginning on 2 October. All are very welcome to come along and Revd Alison Waters extends many thanks to Mr Benbow and the governors for their support.

# Snippets from the August Village Walk & September 2016 Parish Council meeting

## Play and Recreation Area

It is lovely to see so many people of all ages visiting and enjoying the Play and Recreation Area. As you will have observed though, there is an issue with the pathways and floor underneath the shelter. We are waiting for the contractor to return to carry out the repairs and some other corrective issues which we hope will commence shortly. It may mean some or all of the play area may be closed during the duration of the repair but we will advise you by notices at the Play Area and the notice boards.

We will be installing additional fencing to direct people to use the entrance path off the road to hopefully discourage children running across the road from the pub car park. For the same reason the hedge will be trimmed along the verge but it will not be removed. Some trees will be planted in the autumn to enhance the area. Also we are considering proposals to create some formal parking on the verge, and install kerbing and white lining in front of the entrance pathway to improve the safety, thus cars parking here will be 'managed' rather than parking inconsiderately creating potential hazards as now. This may have to be done in stages as funds and permissions from Highways allow.

The play area will be inspected on a weekly basis as part of the RoSPA recommendations. However if you see any defects or notice any problems please advise the parish council as soon as possible. There has been some 'stone throwing' on to the safety



surfacing. We sincerely hope this stops once the paths and shelter flooring have been repaired, as this is dangerous. If you see any children throwing stones, please ask them to stop. We obviously cannot monitor the area continuously so we ask that parents and guardians help shoulder the responsibility.

Finally as part of the Hinkley C grant, we have to submit customer feedback forms to demonstrate the play area met its expectations. We will be handing out these shortly, so we would be grateful if you could complete and return them.

### Village Walk

Briefly, the parish council members walked around the Village one evening in August noting possible enhancements and areas in need of attention. In addition to the various ideas in the vicinity of the play area, we will be arranging vegetation and tree maintenance along the Wharf Rd and trees by the defibrillator; removal of a bicycle thrown in the brook (Gary Perrett has since kindly removed it and taken it to the tip); some minor repairs to the bus shelter including replacement solar light; Highways will be asked to inspect the bridge railings over the brook at Estuary Park for safety reasons. We would like to find out who owns the stone trough and pump at Brookside to possibly restore it and perhaps put plants in it?


The lanterns will take more than one session to create so please try to get to one of the early sessions in the village hall.

The first of the waders are starting to return with Wood Sandpiper, Little Stint, including 550 Dunlin, and 50 Avocet.

It's that time of year, with around 3000 adult Shelduck moulting feathers in Bridgwater Bay, flightless as they replace flight feathers, only juveniles are left on Steart Marshes.

The butterfly walk went well, with the first sighting of an Essex skipper.

If you visit this website to view the network and then zoom in on our parish you will see the map of all of the public rights of way in our area. I shall be regularly keeping a check on our well-used footpaths and be using the website to check out some of the lesser used footpaths. I shall also be using this website to raise any issues with our



Somerset County Council Rights of Way Area Warden who will liaise with landowners and various organizations responsible for the footpaths.

There is also an interesting feature on the website in which you can see the aerial photographic survey of Somerset taken in 1946; some of you will see your homes in the survey. This can be accessed by clicking on the menu at the top of the screen and by zooming in on Otterhampton parish you can see how sparsely populated the area was in 1946.

This time of course it was the British Government who rained on the parade. 
