

Wildlife Update

It's that time of year that the wintering birds are leaving rapidly: 3500 Lapwing on 21st Feb, 2 on 5th March. Golden Plover, Teal, Curlew, Dunlin all greatly reduced. However Shelduck are still in good numbers, we had 574 on site (5th March)

2 Barn Owl seen most evenings and occasional Shorteared Owls.

Great White Egret (picture on right) has been spotted on Stockland Marshes, usually only seen on the intertidal area.



We're now lucky enough to hear 2 singing Cetti's warbler (picture on right) on a daily basis, a species which wasn't present on site last year. This is the only warbler to remain within the UK for the entire year and has a beautiful melodic song.





We have also been getting regular sightings of a Water Rail (picture on left) under our bird feeding station just as you go over the first bridge within the Wetland Walkway. This bird is extremely shy and you more often hear it than see it, so to get such a close up encounter is a fantastic opportunity. Another species that wasn't seen or heard on site until this year, illustrating how as the site is develops the more species it's starting to attract.

We've had a ringed Greenshank frequenting the reserve, our Assistant Warden Joe Cockram, sent the information to the relevant monitoring body and discovered that it was ringed as a passage juvenile in NE Scotland, and over wintered at Steart Marshes. Many of our ringed birds over winter in Ireland, southern England or France, Spain and even Africa. Recently a few have started to over winter with us in NE Scotland due to the milder winters.

Easter weekend
